- summarises the accounting records for the year ended 31 March 2014; and
- confirms and provides assurance on those matters that are important to our audit responsibilities.

Our responsibility is to conduct an audit in accordance with guidance issued by the Audit Commission and, on the basis of our review of the annual return and supporting information, to report whether any matters that come to our attention give cause for concern that relevant legislation and regulatory requirements have not been met.

#### External auditor report (ACNY0236)

On the basis of our review, in our opinion the information in the annual return is in accordance with proper practices and no matters have come to our attention giving cause for concern that relevant legislation and regulatory requirements have not been met.

Other matters not affecting our opinion which we draw to the attention of the Council:

- The Annual Return was not accurately completed before submission for audit. Section 1, Box 2, the annual
  precept, does not agree to the figure notified to us by the precepting authority. The figures in Boxes 2 and 3
  should read £68,026 and £35,771 respectively. All grants, including Council Tax Support Grant, should be shown
  in Box 3, as per the guidance notes on the Annual Return.
- Section 2; Box 8 of the Annual Return has not been completed. The Clerk has confirmed that this should be ticked 'Yes'.
- The bank reconciliation provided for audit did not support Section 1. The bank reconciliation incorrectly
  includes reconciling entries relating to debtors and creditors. Section 1, Box 8 should be £54,265 and the
  debtors and creditors will form part of the reconciliation between Boxes 7 and 8.
