14/01387/FUL – Hollybrook House, Easby Lane – Installation of replacement windows and doors. **No objections.**

14/01635/FUL – 12 Firbank House – Alteration to roof void to form bedroom and conversion of part of garage into kitchen. **No objections.**

14/01628/TPO – 69 High Street – Proposed work to tree subject to Tree Preservation Order No 1992/02. Members strongly opposed this application as it forms an integral part of the High Street Scene and is within a conservation area. This tree is a rare breed and is unique and has over the years been subject to routine maintenance. This is a very mature tree and any growth will now be negligible and any material defects it may have caused, i.e to the footpath etc can all be corrected.

14/01613/FUL – 88 Marwood Drive – Single storey extension and new bay window to side elevation. **No objections.**

14/01642/FUL – 5 Angrove Drive – Loft conversion, porch and rear extension. No objections, however, members did express a concern in relation to over development of the property.

Clerk's Report

Footpath Easby Lane to Suggitts Field – Underground Leak

Northumbrian Water Board had confirmed that the water sample taken was not from their supply. Mr Mullins will continue to try and establish the source of the leak. **Ongoing.**

It was advised that the drains have been cleaned and it would be monitored to see if this had made any improvements when it next rains heavily. **Ongoing.**

Footpath behind Cliffe Terrace

Mr Mullins had suggested that the Council could resurface with planings and that he would look into this. **Ongoing.**

Highways Issues

The Clerk had requested that the disabled parking bay in Park Square paint be refreshed. Cllr Mrs Moorhouse confirmed that Highways had added to their works programme and had requested work dates. The Clerk was asked to contact Highways expressing concern at the length of time this was taking and to advise them that this was now leading to people parking on the pavement etc.

Easby Lane Speeding

The Clerk had advised the partnership that the data logger should be sited between the Angrove junction and Marwood junction. **Ongoing.**

Cllr Mrs Greenwell requested that the Clerk write to Mr and Mrs Ward to request that they arrange for their hedge to be cut in the Hall Fields as it is now very overgrown. **Agreed.**

Cllr Mrs Greenwell sought approval to purchase two reindeer for the Santa Sleigh at a cost of £189 +vat each and £70 delivery fee. **Agreed.**

Cllr Kirk asked the Clerk to write to Yatton House to thank them for all the years they have maintained their allotment. **Agreed.**

Cllr Kirk asked the Clerk to write to Great Ayton Cricket & Football Club (GAC&FC) congratulating them on reaching the T20 finals which would be televised on Tuesday 9 September 2014. **Agreed.**

Cllr Fletcher asked the Clerk to inform GAC&FC that if they would like the museum to be opened when the tv crew come he was happy to do so. **Noted.**

Cllr Fletcher requested that the Clerk report the manhole cover opposite the museum to highways as it is extremely dangerous. **Agreed.**

Cllr Jackson informed Members that the Tennis Club lease was due to expire in two years and that the brewery were not willing to renew it at this stage as they were considering other developments. **Noted.**

Cllr Readman reported two footpaths requiring attention, one was between 102 and 104 Roseberry Crescent and the other was the bus stop opposite Camp Corner. The Clerk confirmed that she had reported both these to Highways and was awaiting a response. **Noted.**

Cllr Readman requested an update in relation to the Low Green and in particular what action could be taken if Travellers took up residency on it. It was agreed that the Clerk should write to HDC to ask what (if any) assistance they would provide in this instance. **Agreed.**
