	Village Fete - Cllr Fletcher would contact Mr Sillars to see if he would be available and willing to carry out		
	the commentating at the Fete. The Clerk was asked to write to Mr Bone requesting that he bring his		
	steam engine to lead the parade. The Clerk was asked to look into traffic management training for		
	nominated Councillors so that there was no longer a requirement to employ a traffic management		
	company. Cllr Hudson would look into purchasing cones. Noted and Agreed.		
	Tour de Yorkshire - Cllr Fletcher provided a full update on the proposed events. It was noted that the		
	Local Businesses have had a number of meetings and had progressed a number of ideas and were taking		
	the lead in organising all of the days events. Anyone wanting to donate old bicycles were asked to take		
	them to Ayton Fish Shop who had kindly agreed to store them. Rev Peverall had confirmed that the tables		
	from the Parochial Hall could be utilised and Mr Thompson had agreed to collect them. Mr Suggitt continues to carry our re-paint work to the bridges and railings along the High Street and both him and the

Cemetery Superintendent were carrying out other maintenance and cleaning work around the Village. The Clerk was asked to make signs for wheelchair viewing only to ensure that a designated area was set aside. The Clerk would ascertain when the bunting was due to be delivered and to confirm the allocation of £500 from HDC. It was agreed that set-up would commence on Saturday evening and that a letter would be sent to the High Green residents advising them that the road would not be accessible from Saturday evening to Sunday evening. **Agreed.**

Cllrs Fletcher and Hudson were thanked for leading on this event on behalf of the Parish Council.

Queens 90th Birthday - Mr and Mrs Sutcliffe had kindly granted their permission for a beacon to be lit on Captain Cooks in recognition of the Queen's 90th Birthday and the Clerk would update them on progress to date. A full risk assessment had been completed and the Pageant Master informed as well as the Police and Fire Service. Cleveland Search and Rescue would assist with the set up and it was planned to light the beacon at 8.15 pm. Cllr Fletcher would approach the Deputy Lord Lieutenant to see if he would be available to light the beacon. **Agreed.**
